Attendance and Lateness

**Good attendance is anything above 96%,
Attendance below 96% but higher than 90% is considered to be of concern,
Attendance falling below 90% is classed as a persistent absenteeism.**

We understand that for some of our children missing school is sometimes unavoidable and indeed they may have had prolonged periods of illness which we know about and take steps to support parents while their children are unwell. Some children go through periods of being unwell and seem to be susceptible to all viruses their peers catch.

Gosforth Schools' Trust are committed to sharing the same message. Every day your child is out of school results in an unauthorised absence for each session, they miss (two sessions per day). Please see our current policy for Attendance on our website. The policy is currently under review and we will inform you when it has been agreed by our Governing Body.

Lateness is another contributing factor to children's loss of learning. The gates open at **8:30am**, classes open at **8:40am** and learning begins at **8:45am**. The gates are left open until **9am** to account for any minor lateness.

Medication and Medical Plans

If your child needs medication in school, please ensure you take it to the school office it should not be handed over on the door without completing the relevant forms. It is crucial that we have up to date medical information and procedures in place to be able to care for your children appropriately. If your child is in reception or has a new medical issue please get in touch with Mrs Lee.

Photographs

Please do not take photographs on the school site or of the displays in the windows. We know that you will want to treasure these so photographs and work will eventually be sent home.

Safety

It is probably a good time to consider parking and access to school. The car park at the front of the school is always very busy, please take care and ensure all children are with an adult when walking through the car park and outside of school. Please remind your children to walk rather than cycle or scoot in the car park. Cars should only park/stop in a designated bay. We have a very limited number of parking spaces for our disabled families. Please be aware that the two disabled bays and area outside of the hall are for **Blue Badge holders only**.

The staff car park is always extremely busy and with staff having to triple park, please do not try to park in the staff car park, on the yellow lines outside of the school gates or block any of our neighbours' access.

Uniform

We have just updated our uniform policy and will send it out to you by Parentmail for your reference. Please pay particular attention to hairstyles, jewellery and PE kits. Our pre-loved uniform was a real success last term and we have now made this a permanent fixture at the front of the school. From time to time we will put a notice out if we run short of particular garments and sizes. Thank you for your support in this venture.
