The Governors were invited into school to observe teaching and learning in Geography and History across all year groups.

The children were eager and demonstrated their love for learning. Many of the groups were enthused by recent trips and visits to local areas to help put their learning into context and recognise that history and geography is actively on their doorstep.

The children were asked questions specific to their subjects, such as 'why do we use a map?' and 'What did the Ancient Greeks do for us?'. It was encouraging to see the children's interaction and willingness to openly share their thoughts and opinions on the subjects in discussion. They knew whether the subject was History or Geography, and were clear on how this can relate to exciting future careers.
