We know that many of us are now feeling the impact of the current financial climate. If your family is in need of support please contact us as we may be able to help. ### Uniform Policy

We have recently updated a number of school policies including our Uniform Policy. I would like to ask that you check the policy carefully especially with reference to jewellery and hair colours.

# Safeguarding Policy

We have also updated our Safeguarding policy. There are a few points to bring to your attention including how we carry out filtering and monitoring. In order to keep children and staff safe online we use a programme called Senso.cloud this alerts myself and Mrs Appleby to any safeguarding concerns on any device in school linked to the internet or our server. We also use Surfprotect as a filtering system. You can see details of this in our policy and how it fits into our safeguarding procedures.

You will also find details of our Safeguarding Team including our Designated Link Governor Cristina Wigg. If ever you have concerns about a child, please feel free to ask for a member of the team and let the office staff know it is a safeguarding concern.

# The School Day

Please ensure your child is in school to start learning at 8:45am. The gates are open at 8:30 and classroom doors open at 8:40, register opens at 8:45am. There are quite a number of children arriving after this time and losing out on valuable learning. If your child does not arrive to school until 9am they are losing an hour and 15 minutes of learning over one week alone. The gates close at 9am.

# Safety

Now the darker mornings, evenings and changes in weather is upon us, I am asking you to consider if you really need to access our school car park. I am sad to report that we have had to involve the police yet again when the car park is not used with care. Please follow these rules:



- Ensure you use the one-way system
- Do not double park or block people in spaces
- Only families with blue badges are permitted to park in the disabled bays or alongside the hall
- Please do not park if you are not in a bay
- Waiting is not permitted if you are not in a bay
- Do not park on the yellow lines around school
- Do not park on pavements outside of school.
- Do not park in the staff car park

It is advisable whenever possible to park in the town centre away from the streets around school. I have had to report several incidents of verbal abuse and people refusing to follow requests to move. I have taken this up with our governors and have requested the support of the Local Authority on our options.

#### Attendance

We have a new policy for attendance on the website that I hope you will take a look at. It is really important that your child attends school unless they are unwell. In your parent consultations, the class teacher will have given you a summary of your child's attendance. If they have fallen below 96% their attendance will be monitored and I may follow this up with a letter if the attendance does not improve. If however, your child's attendance falls below 90% they then become a greater concern and classed as persistently absent. Any attendance below 50% is a very serious concern. The Local Authority monitor attendance and visit school each term to discuss specific cases and sometimes meet with parents or a letter maybe issued on behalf of the Local Authority. You will see that the policy is more robust and sets out the potential outcomes of children being persistently absent or taking holidays in term time.

Just to confirm, requests for holidays will be denied and children will be given an unauthorised absence for every session they miss. There is a total of 10 sessions in any normal week. There are very few exceptional circumstances that allow Headteachers to authorise absences.

If your child is going to be off, please leave a message on the absence line each day that they are absent. If we do not hear from you when the register closes, we will attempt to contact you for a reason for absence. This is part of our duty in safeguarding children. If we cannot reach you by telephone, we will continue down the contact list you have given us until we can reach someone.

Gosforth Schools' Trust and Newcastle City Council are committed to raising attendance.
